Governance & Funding

- Stratford Public Library was created by By-law 664 in 1897 (amended 1985)
- ▶ SPL is a non-profit corporation, regulated by the Public Libraries Act RSO 1990
- ▶ SPL is governed by a Board of 11: 10 citizen representatives, and 1 Council representative (Councillor Ingram). All Board members are appointed by City Council.
- ▶ 84% funded by the City of Stratford
- ▶ 16% funded through other grants, internally-generated revenue, donations

Mission

An equitable, safe and welcoming environment where anyone can explore, learn, create and connect.

- Home Delivery Service to nursing homes and individual residences



2014 By the Numbers



In 2014, the Library was used over 1,000,000 times

Including:

314,328 items checked out 275,000 research database queries 228,356 website visits 143,579 in-person visits 28,665 Wi-Fi/computer uses 13,964 program attendees

Highlights of 2015

- ► Calculation of the Library's Economic Impact in the City of Stratford. For every \$1 spent, the City of receives \$7.48 in benefits.
- Modification to the format and curriculum of the Early Literacy Storytimes and Summer Reading Program.
- Reconfigured Children's Floor.
- Replacement of the 11-year old Public Library On Wheels van through fundraising.
- Partnership with the Avon Maitland District School Board to provide all students with a card and orientation to Library resources.



Plans for 2016

- Creation of quiet study room; refurbishment of children's programming room
- Redesigned programs for adults
- Continuation of projects with AMDSB and University of Waterloo
- Collection and evaluation of data related to program success
- Expansion of services for youth ages 12+

2016 Draft Budget

- 2.49% increase = \$51,093
- Budget Increases:
 - ► COLA for staff, step increases for newer hires
 - Increases for basic operational expenditures: hydro, internet, telephone
- Revenue Reductions:
 - ▶ Declining fine revenue: \$13,000 less in 2015 than 2013
 - Reduction of Provincial support: core research databases de-funded
 - ► Replacement cost \$15,000

2016 Draft Budget

- Budget Reductions:
 - Reduction of 0.2FTE
 - All discretionary budget lines held, including lending materials, which are projected to have 3-7% cost increase in 2016
- Service Reductions:
 - Research databases reduced by 30%
 - Support staff capacity further reduced; library users may encounter longer wait times for materials
