MINOR VARIANCE APPLICATIONS

A40-21 - 401 Erie Street - Planner: Jeff Bannon



Purpose: The purpose of this application under Section 44 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990 is to reduce the front yard setback for five proposed parking spaces and two existing parking spaces.

Variances requested:

• To reduce the front yard setback from 7.5 meters to 0 meters.

A41-21 - Countryside Developments - Planner: Jeff Bannon



Purpose: The purpose of this application under Section 44 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990 is to increase the maximum lot coverage from 40% to 45% for single detached dwelling lots.

Variances requested:

• To increase the maximum lot coverage from 40% to 45% for single detached dwelling lots.

A42-21 - 83-87 East Gore Street - Planner: Jeff Bannon



Purpose: The purpose of this application under Section 44 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990 is to reduce the front yard setback and aggregate side yard setback for the existing semi-detached dwelling.

Variances requested:

Retained parcel (B):

- 1. To reduce the front yard setback from 7.5m to 5.36m.
- 2. To reduce the aggregate side yard setback from 5.0m to 4.19m.

Severed parcel (A):

- 1. To reduce the front yard setback from 7.5m to 5.61m.
- 2. To reduce the aggregate side yard setback from 5.0m to 4.07m.

CONSENT APPLICATIONS

B11-21 - 319-321 Redford Crescent - Planner: Jeff Bannon



The purpose of the application is to sever the subject lands at 312-321 Redford Crescent to create a semidetached lot on the subject property. The proposed severed lands would have an approximate frontage of 9.89 m, an approximate depth of 30.5 m, and an approximate area of 301.4 m2.

The proposed retained lands would have a frontage of approximately 10.2 m, an approximate depth of 30.5 m and an approximate area of 311.7 m2.

The retained lands and severed lands are occupied with a semi-detached dwelling.

B12-21 - 83-87 East Gore Street - Planner: Jeff Bannon



The purpose of the application is to sever the subject lands at 83-87 East Gore Street to sever a semi-detached dwelling into two separate parcels of land. The proposed severed lands would have an approximate frontage of 9.28m, an approximate depth of 45.6m and an approximate area of 413.7sq.m.

The proposed retained lands would have a frontage of approximately 9.0m, an approximate depth of 45.6m and an approximate area of 519.4sq.m.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of Stratford Committee of Adjustment in respect of the proposed consent, you must make a written request to the Secretary-Treasurer, Stratford Committee of Adjustment, Jeff Bannon, 82 Erie Street, 2nd Floor Stratford, ON N5A 2M4. This will also entitle you to be advised of a possible Ontario Land Tribunal hearing. Even if you are the successful party, you should request a copy of the decision since the Stratford Committee of Adjustment decision may be appealed to the Ontario Land Tribunal by the applicant or another member of the public.
