Architectural Description: one storey with mansard roof and dormers; brick painted light grey; brick quoins painted white and decorative brick work below the decorative paneled frieze; ground floor; segmentally arched window with six panes over six on either side of the door; the curved brick voussoirs are painted white; porch; open rectangular with flat roof supported by Doric columns at the front corner and flat Doric columns against the wall; the porch roof has dentils under the roof; the door has a transom with four window and single pane side light on each side with a wooden panel below; on the slope of the mansard roof are three evenly spaced dormers each has a gable roof with decorative wood

work and brackets; the centre dormer has eight panes in it while the dormer on either side has two panes over two.

The house started out as an Ontario Cottage in 1855 and was altered in 1887 to become a Second Empire style by James Dow, an agricultural dealer and medicine distributor.
