**Architectural Description:** two storey; yellow brick Italianate with hipped roof and centre gable on main house at right; one storey yellow brick; gable roof Gothic Revival on left side; has three segmentally arched one over one paned windows; round stained glass window in the peak; pointed frieze board and brackets under the eaves; this is an addition to the main house. Main house first floor; two segmentally arched one over one windows under porch on left; double glazed and paneled door on right; open porch supported by square fluted posts with decorative brackets and spool work under the eaves; plain railing; second floor; three segmentally arched one over one windows; round louvered window in peak; pointed frieze board and decorative brackets set in pairs under eaves.

The house was built for William Nichol, a merchant. In 1908 the house was bought by Reverend A. G. McLachlin, a Presbyterian minister and remained in the family until 1977.
