Our Governance

- Public Library Service is free in the Province
- The library board is a governing body that gets its authority from the Public Library Act
- Our library board is a governance board, 10 members of the public, 1 City Council rep
- The library board appoints a CEO to oversee library operations and the hiring of library staff,
- The municipality is the library's primary funder

2023 Operating Budget

- Approved by the Library Board on October 4, 2022
- 2% COLA for staff wages and benefits
- Increases to benefit costs
- Adjusted a number of operational lines to reflect actual spending patterns
