MINOR VARIANCE APPLICATIONS

A13-23 - 173 WILLIAM STREET: PLANNER - V. WEN

The purpose of this application under Section 45(1) of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990 is to increase the maximum height of a dwelling to facilitate the construction of a single detached dwelling with an elevator shaft. This matter was deferred by the Committee at the July 31, 2023 meeting.

CONSENT APPLICATIONS

The purpose of the request to revise application B08-22 is to amend conditions of this provisionally granted consent to establish an easement (2.5 m in width) at the north end of the property to facilitate a water service to the proposed new lot on the west side of 26 Cobourg Lane. The watermain is proposed to connect to the existing water service on St. David Street.

The purpose of applications B11-23, B12-23 and B13-23 to establish easements (2.5 m and 3.0 m in width) on 16 and 22 Cobourg Lane and 31 St. David Street to facilitate a water service to a proposed new lot on the west side of 26 Cobourg Lane. The watermain is proposed to connect to the existing water service on St. David Street.

MINOR VARIANCE & CONSENT APPLICATIONS

A20-23 & B10-23 - 601-603 Downie Street: Planner - A. Burnett

The purpose of application A20-23 is to reduce the minimum distance from an interior side lot line from 1.0 m to 0.76 m to recognize an existing accessory structure on the northern portion of the lands, municipally known as 601 Downie Street. In addition, a reduction is requested for the minimum distance from an interior side lot line from 1.0 m to 0.54 m for an existing accessory structure, municipally known as 603 Downie Street to facilitate the creation a new lot line from a consent to sever.

Variance requested:

- Table 4.1.2 Accessory Building or Structure Locations, to reduce the minimum distance from an interior side lot line from 1.0 m to 0.76 m; and
- Table 4.1.2 Accessory Building or Structure Locations, to reduce the minimum distance from an interior side lot line from 1.0 m to 0.54 m.



The purpose of application B10-23 is to sever the southern portion of the lands, municipally known as 603 Downie Street. The proposed lot will have an approximate frontage of 10.98 m, depth of 30.48 m, and an area of 334.7 m2. The lands to be severed currently contain one side of a semi-detached dwelling and will have frontage and road access to Downie Street.

The lands to be retained (601 Downie Street) will contain the other side of a semi-detached dwelling and will have an approximate frontage of 10.97 m, depth of 30.52 m and an area of 334.6 m2. The semi-detached dwelling will have frontage and road access to Downie Street.

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the City of Stratford Committee of Adjustment in respect of the proposed consent does not make written submissions to the City of Stratford Committee of Adjustment before it gives or refuses to give a provisional consent, the Ontario Land Tribunal may dismiss the appeal.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of Stratford Committee of Adjustment in respect of the proposed consent, you must make a written request to the Secretary-Treasurer, Stratford Committee of Adjustment, Vincent Wen, 82 Erie Street, 3rd Floor Stratford, ON N5A 2M4. This will also entitle you to be advised of a possible Ontario Land Tribunal hearing. Even if you are the successful party, you should request a copy of the decision since the Stratford Committee of Adjustment decision may be appealed to the Ontario Land Tribunal by the applicant or another member of the public.
