The purpose of this application is to create a right-of-way on 428 Forman Avenue over an existing driveway off of Oakdale Avenue in favour of 220 Oakdale Avenue to allow 220 Oakdale Avenue to use the driveway to access parking. The proposed right of way is an irregular shape and is proposed to have a width between 7.69m and 6m, an approximate depth of 71.84m, and an approximate area of 458m².

For those persons who wish to participate orally at the meeting, please contact the Secretary Treasurer at jbannon@stratford.ca no later than **10:00 am on Tuesday June 30, 2020**. During the meeting there will be an active chat function where any member of the public can provide written comments during the meeting. The comments received will be read by the moderator during the public comment portion of the meeting.

Changes to the Municipal Act allows the Committee of Adjustment to participate in open meetings electronically and be counted for the purposes of quorum during emergencies declared locally or provincially under the Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act. If the emergency declared is terminated prior to the hearing, the public meeting will then be held in the City of Stratford Council Chambers in City Hall, 1 Wellington Street, Stratford, or at an alternative location subject to direction from the Province and Huron Perth Public Health, on the date and time the meeting is currently scheduled.

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the City of Stratford Committee of Adjustment in respect of the proposed consent does not make written submissions to the City of Stratford Committee of Adjustment before it gives or refuses to give a provisional consent, the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal may dismiss the appeal.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of Stratford Committee of Adjustment in respect of the proposed consent, you must make a written request to the Secretary-Treasurer, Stratford Committee of Adjustment, Jeff Bannon, 82 Erie Street, 2nd Floor Stratford, ON N5A 2M4. This will also entitle you to be advised of a possible Local Planning Appeal Tribunal hearing. Even if you are the successful party, you should request a copy of the decision since the Stratford Committee of Adjustment decision may be appealed to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal by the applicant or another member of the public.

Personal information collected as part of this Notice is pursuant to the Municipal Act, 2001 and the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act. Personal information collected as a result of this Notice will

FREE PARKING EXTENDED – AUGUST 30, 2020

Free parking has been extended in the downtown core until August 30, 2020.

What does this mean?

It means you do not have to pay the meter or machine, but maximum parking time limits remain in effect.

What is a parking time limit?

This means if you are parking in an area with a 4-hour limit you **MUST** move your vehicle before the 4 hour time limit has expired. Failure to do so could result in a parking ticket being issued. All maximum parking time limits are being enforced.

All other provisions of the By-law, including no-parking and no-stopping, will remain in effect as well and will be enforced from Monday-Saturday 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

PUBLIC WASHROOM – RE-OPENING

On June 6, the City of Stratford began a staged approach to the re-opening of its public washrooms. The first stage of the re-opening included the washrooms at:

- The tourist booth/boathouse
- Upper Queen's Park
- The William Allman Memorial Arena (outdoor)
- North shore of the Avon River

Those facilities will be open daily from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., and will be cleaned and disinfected regularly.

Please follow the guidance of health professionals when using public washrooms including:

- maintaining safe social distancing (stay 2m/6ft away from others),
- staying home if you are sick, and
- washing your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, to help guard against the spread of COVID-19.
