

- The visibility of Social Issues within the community continue to concern the public


TRENDS IN POLICING:





- Calls for service increased in 2023 when compared to 2022 which had 24,932 occurrences generated. In 2020 there was a dramatic decrease in occurrences due to the Covid-19 Pandemic. The number of occurrences then rose in 2021 and 2022 and are now slightly lower than 2019 which had 25,566 occurrences generated.


Five Year Occurrence Count



- The year of 2019 showed the highest number of occurrences generated when compared to the last five years. However, 2023 had the highest number of occurrences generated in the last five years when looking at only Stratford occurrences.
- The busiest time of day is from 10am to 3pm with an increase again at 8pm. This has been consistent over the five-year comparison.
- In 2023 Friday is the busiest day and Sunday is the least busy for occurrences generated.
- In 2023 the busiest months of the year were May and June, and the slowest months are December and February.

Dispatch and Arrival Times Averages (minutes)





- In 2023 on priority 1 calls, the average time for police to arrive was 4.85 minutes and the average time from the call until police are dispatched was 1.86 minutes. Therefore 2023 increased by 7.56% when compared to 2022 for average time for police to arrive. Further, 2023 increased by .81% for average time from call until police are dispatched when compared to 2022.
- In 2023 the fastest time for police to arrive and time until police are dispatched is the month of April and the slowest is December. January also tends to be a slower month for time it takes for police to arrive due to weather conditions and this has been consistent when comparing to previous years.
- In 2023 the fastest time for police to arrive and time from call until police are dispatched is Wednesday and the slowest are Thursday and Friday.





- In Stratford there was a decrease in collisions in 2020 and 2021 which was due to people staying home more during the Covid-19 pandemic. 2023 is still lower than 2019.


MVCYearly Comparison

- In 2023 E-ticket occurrences generated increased by 1.83% when compared to 2022. The 2058 e-tickets generated is still lower than the 2376 in 2021.
- In 2023 impaired occurrences increased by 9.26% when compared to 2022. Both 2023 and 2022 are significantly lower than the 74 impaireds that occurred in 2021.
- Warnings issued stayed consistent from 2020 to 2022. However, in 2023 there was an increase by 11.01% when compared to 2022.

- Due to the Covid-19 pandemic and the stayat-home order, 2020 to 2022 showed a decrease in charges laid when compared to 2019. The reason for this is due to less HTA and CAIA charges being laid. However, in 2023 there was a slight increase when compared to 2022.
- In 2020 to 2023 HTA charges decreased by approximately 40.% when compared to 2019.
- CDSA charges decreased slightly between 2020 and 2022. However, there was an increase by 12.72% in 2023 when compared to 2022.



- In 2023 drug charges increased by 12.25% when compared to 2022.
- The amount of fentanyl seized by Stratford Police rose dramatically in 2023. There was also an increase in the amount of meth seized.

Suicides including attempts increased by 37.5% in 2023


- All of the categories relating to social welfare listed above increased in 2023 compared to the year before.
- From 2020 to 2023 there were 100 overdoses reported to the Police. Of the 100 overdoses, 14 resulted in a fatality.

 Narcan was administered in 52 of the overdoses.
- The Mobile Crisis Rapid Response Team (MCRRT) assisted Police on 332 occurrences in 2020, 1207 in 2021, 773 in 2022 and 1015 in 2023.

- In 2023 there was 430 violent occurrences reported, compared to 383 in 2022, 336 in 2021 and 317 in 2020.
- There is an average of 30 to 40 Sexual Assaults reported to Stratford Police every year. However, in 2022 there were 55 sexual assaults and in 2023 there were 44 reported to the police.
- Police investigated 4 attempt homicides in 2019 to 2023. All of these occurrences resulted in charges laid. There were no homicides in 2019 to 2023.
- Assault Police occurrences decreased by 33% when comparing 2023 to 2022.



- Charges were laid in 17.3% of the domestic related occurrences in 2020 to 2023.
- St Marys accounted for 14.19% of the domestic related occurrences reported to Police in 2023.
- Perth South accounted for 1.33 of the domestic related occurrences reported to Police in 2023.

Both parties were charged on 6% of the occurrences where charges were laid





- Overall property offences in 2023 increased slightly by 2.77% when compared to 2022 and decreased slightly by 2.11% when comparing 2023 to 2021.
- Theft from motor vehicles decreased by 16.67 % when comparing 2023 to 2022. Both years are dramatically lower than the 356 in 2021.
- Theft of vehicles decreased by 29.49% when comparing 2023 to 2022.
- Break and enters slightly increased by 5% in 2023.
 However, 2023, 2022 and 2021 are all lower than 2020.

Accountability and transparency go a long way to building trust between the public and the police. There are two independent civilian investigative agencies in Ontario whose mandates are to investigate the conduct of police officers or the policies of the police service.

The Office of the Independent Review Director (OIPRD) now known as the Law Enforcement Complaints Agency (LECA) investigates all complaints where a member of the public alleges that an officer has committed misconduct under the Police Services Act or that the policies or services provided by the police service did not comply with the Act.

"Police officers are expected to act with honesty and integrity and not abuse the extraordinary powers and authority they are granted. Police officers are also expected to treat people with respect and to act in a manner that does not discredit or undermine public confidence in the police service." www.oiprd.ca

The Stratford Police saw the number of public complaints increase drastically during the COVID-19 epidemic peaking at 20 for the years 2021 and 2022. There was a slight decrease to 18 in 2023. Of the 18 complaints received, 5 were screened out by OIPRD as not with their mandate or not in the public interest to investigate and 13 were referred to investigation. Of the 13 complaints that were investigated 8 alleged Discreditable Conduct, 3 alleged Neglect of Duty and 2 alleged Unlawful Exercise of Authority. In all 13 cases the complaints against the officer were found to be unsubstantiated after investigation meaning there was no misconduct on the part of the officers.

The second independent civilian investigative agency in Ontario is the Special Investigations Unit which investigates incidents involving police officers where there has been death, serious injury or allegations of sexual assault where there may be criminal conduct on the part of the officer(s).

The were 2 SIU investigations in 2023. The SIU terminated one investigation after the body worn camera evidence proved that there was no evidence to support the allegation. The second investigation resulted in the officer being charged under the Criminal Code of Canada and that case has been resolved through the courts.
