**Architectural Description:** Two-storey brick, timber, and stucco gabled home with six over one rectangular windows located on the corner of Shrewsbury St. and St. David St. First floor: red brick on a stucco foundation; verandah with columns and tongue and groove ceiling. Second floor: stucco and timber construction with bellcast roof.

Samuel Dunseith, an American clergyman and later broker, built this house in 1907 for his aging mother, Sarah J. Dunseith (1934-1927). Although S. J. Dunseith's adult children were spread throughout North America, they often spent their vacations in their Stratford family home. The house remained in the Dunseith family until 1931, four years after S. J. Dunseith's death.
