Architectural Style Ontario Cottage:

Architectural Description: one storey; hipped roof; light red brick with yellow brick accents at the corners the windows and around the door and under the eaves; the windows on the right and left of the centre entrance door are the same; segmentally arched six panes over six; three rows of brick voussoirs and a single row of brick on either side of the windows plus yellow brick panels below the window make these windows stand out; entrance porch; open porch with curved roof supported by two Ionic columns at each corner in the front and a flat Ionic column set against the wall on either side of the door; the door has a curved transom with three panes, the centre one is larger than the other

two; the sidelights have three panes each; the brick voussiors over the door are the same as the ones over the windows; two rows of brick frame the door on either side.

The front part of the house was built by architect-builder Thomas Orr for artisan tinsmith, Thomas J. Birch.
